
COVID-19 UPDATE: Warner Library Transitions to Online Model, Services Available Remotely

Warner Library is taking measures to ensure the health and safety of our students, staff, and faculty, while continuing to support our patrons. While access to the library space is unavailable at this time, our resources, support, and services are available online!

- ***Remote access to Resources: You can still access Warner's databases, e-Books, research guides, and more from our website. Simply plug in your EU username and password.
- ***Chat with a Librarian: Consultations can be scheduled and held as online meetings via Zoom, phone or email. Request a library consultation using the **Request a Research Consultation form.**
- ***We are extending due dates for print materials in our collection, including media, to May 10, 2020.
- ***If you wish to return books or media, you can pop them in the mail to Warner Library, 1300 Eagle Road St. Davids, PA. 19087
- *** AT THIS TIME EZ Borrow Interlibrary Loan is not available. You will not be fined for overdue materials. However, they are all due back no later than May 10.
- ***Rapid ILL for articles continues under normal operating procedures.

How to Use the New Mail Service

1. Place a hold on a book from the <u>library's catalog</u>. (See this <u>guide</u> for more directions.)

2. We will retrieve your materials and mail them to you and also follow up with an email to confirm your request and our actions.

3. When you are finished with the materials, you can return them with the **return label** provided by the library for easy, no-cost shipping.

Free Access to APA Style Guide Manual

Get full access to the APA Style Guide from home! APA has provided **free access to the ebook** versions of the 6th and 7th edition of their Publication Manuals through **May 25, 2020**. Here's how to get the ebook:

Go to bookshelf.vitalsource.com.

- 1. Create a VitalSource account with your **Eastern University email**.
- 2. A confirmation email will be sent to your Eastern account. Confirm your VitalSource account.
- 3. Log in to VitalSource and search for APA Publication Manual.

Choose the 6th or 7th edition of the APA Publication Manual. Select Borrow.

You can also download VitalSource's bookshelf app for IOS or Android to access the manual on your devices.

Go directly to: A to Z Journal List

Type in the title of the book you want to find a commentary on, along with the word "commentary," and click "Search." (For example, "Genesis commentary" or "Matthew commen tary."

You will need your MyEastern login information to gain access, whether on or off campus.

On the results page, make sure to select the "e-Books" box under "*Limit by Source Type*" on the left. Then you have your results!

Downloading an E-Book to Your Computer

In order to download a chapter or an entire ebook, you will need a MyEBSCO account and download the Adobe Digital Editions program to your computer. Both are free, so long as you use your Eastern email address to sign up.

Getting a MyEBSCO account:

1. Click Sign In at the top right of the screen, on the maroon bar.

2. Create an account using the link at the bottom of the sign in page, and follow the on-screen instructions.

3. After you've verified your account, sign in to access your account.

Downloading Adobe Digital Editions:

1. Once you've found the ebook you want to download, either click "Full Download" for the entire ebook, or select the specific chapter you want to download. Different ebooks have different lengths of time they can be downloaded, so bear in mind that the book will need to be redownloaded once the time has passed. 2. Click the Adobe Digital Editions hyperlink in the resulting pop-up window in order to download the program in a separate window. Follow all on-screen instructions to complete the download. 3. Click the Download button to add the ebook or chapter to Adobe Digital Editions, which is housed on your computer's desktop. Doing this allows you to read the ebook while offline.


