# PRINTS FROM THE GOEBEL COLLECTION LINE PALL SPACES

Warner Library is once again collaborating with Montco and Patrick Rodgers, Galleries Director at the college, to showcase the third installation of the Harry C. Goebel print collection.

There are a number of events taking place on the campus, including the exhibit itself titled *Faces, Places, and Liminal Spaces: Prints from the Goebel Collection* from October 16 to December 15. Held at the Blue Bell Fine Arts Center Gallery, this exhibit will showcase prints from the Renaissance through the mid-20th century and focuses on portraiture, caricature, creatures and compelling views of nature and architecture by graphic artists from Europe, North America and Japan. Featured artists include Goya, Renoir, Picasso, Whistler, Minami, Watanabe and more. Two separate curatorial tours of the exhibit will take place on **October 24 from 4-5PM and 5:30-6:30PM**.

Additionally, the event titled *Manga and Mochi with Marina* will take place on **November 13 from 5-6:30PM**. International scholar of Japanese visual culture Marina De Melo Do Nascimento will host a discussion about the history of Japanese manga and printmaking, as well as their influence today. Mocha will be provided while participants view the manga on display in the exhibit.
