## OpenAthens Is Here!

Out with the old, in with the new: introducing **OpenAthens**, a brand new authentication system for our databases and journals.

Managed by Ebsco, a popular database vendor themselves, OpenAthens will work in tandem with Eastern's single sign-on service to provide seamless access to the library's online resources. If you are already signed onto your Eastern email, Brightspace or MyEastern, you will be able to go directly into an Eastern accessible database *without* having to sign in again! You can do this directly through the [A to Z Database homepage](#), or through the [Single Sign-On portal](#).

Additionally, you'll be able to create a MyAthens account, which allows you to save searches and create folders across multiple databases, regardless of their vendors. Any previous accounts you've made, such as a MyEbsco account, can be merged with your new account following [these instructions](#). As the summer continues, you will see the links change across the website; we anticipate having all links updated before the end of June.

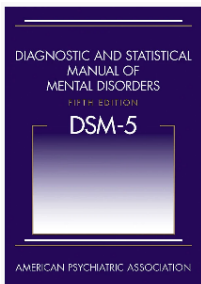


# Several new databases have arrived at the library

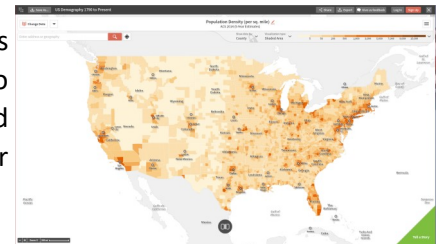
In our pursuit of continued access to excellent, academic sources for research, Warner Library has procured linkage to four new databases, each from a different field of study. All of the databases can be found on our [A to Z Database homepage](#):

- Criminal Justice Full Text = Technically, we already had this Ebsco-owned database, but only with abstracts. Now students can find full text articles covering all areas of criminal justice. Nearly 200 of the most important journals within the discipline are included, and examples of subjects covered include corrections and prisons, criminal investigation, law and procedure, and police and policing.



- DSM-5 Library = Now available in electronic format, the DSM-5 is the most comprehensive, current and critical resource for clinical practice available to today's mental health clinicians and researchers of all orientations. Several handbooks and clinical cases are also included, along with a Spanish language edition.

- Social Explorer = Using this tool, students can create graphs and maps across a multitude of statistical data, from population and income to unemployment and education. Various data sets can be combined in a myriad of ways with easy to use sliders and color coordination, which then allows for your creation to be downloaded for presentation purposes.



- Teaching Channel Videos = Last but certainly not least, the Education Department can use the videos in the Teaching Channel as a tool to learn diverse techniques to help every student grow. You can search across various subjects and grade levels on a variety of topics, including technology in the classroom, lesson planning and ESL.

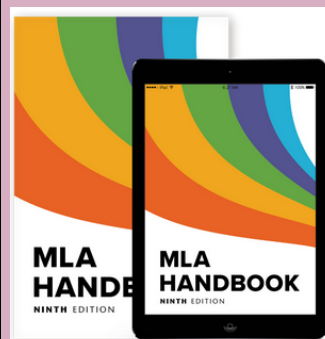
